

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
SUBMITTED TO THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION
PURSUANT TO 36 CFR 800. 6 (a)

WHEREAS, the General Services Administration has determined that the alteration of one Judge's suite on the eighth floor of the United States Courthouse at 1010 Fifth Avenue in Seattle, Washington, will have an effect upon the United States Courthouse a property included in the National Register of Historic Places, and has consulted with the Washington State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800, regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470f);

NOW, THEREFORE, the General Services Administration and the Washington State Historic Preservation Officer agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the undertaking on the historic properties.

STIPULATIONS

The General Services Administration will ensure that the following measures are carried out. Prior to the alteration of the Judge's suite on the eighth floor of the United States Courthouse, Seattle, Washington, the General Services Administration shall request that the National Park Service, Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS), determine what documentation shall be required to adequately record this suite. The General Services Administration shall ensure that, unless otherwise agreed to by the National Park Service, all documentation will be completed and accepted by HABS prior to the alteration of the Judge's suite and that copies of the documentation will be made available to the SHPO and to appropriate local archives designated by the Washington SHPO.

Execution of this Memorandum of Agreement by the General Services Administration and the Washington State SHPO, its subsequent acceptance by the Council, and implementation of its terms, evidence that the General Services Administration has afforded the Council an opportunity to comment on the alteration of the United States Courthouse eighth floor Judge's suite in Seattle and its effects on historic properties, and that the General Services Administration has taken into account the effects of the undertaking on historic properties.
