
Appendix A

Joseph Ellicott Historic Preservation District

Buffalo, New York

This district comprises

- all the properties on the north side of Seneca from Main to Franklin Street,
- those on the east side of Franklin to Swan,
- those on the north side of Swan to the Upper Terrace to South Elmwood,
- those on the east side of South Elmwood to West Mohawk (including St. Vincent of Padua R.C. Church on the west side of South Elmwood),
- those on the south side of West Mohawk to Franklin,
- those on the west side of Franklin to Church,
- those on the south side of Church across Main to South Division,
- those on the north side of South Division to Oak,
- those on the west side of Oak to Swan,
- those on the south side of Swan to Washington,
- those on the west side of Washington to Seneca and
- those on the south side of Seneca back to Main.



The Joseph Ellicott Historic Preservation District is a designated local preservation district, approved November 30, 1982, Common Council Proceedings Item No. 161. The District has been identified as eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places by the State Historic Preservation Office of New York.

The Joseph Ellicott District includes all the buildings and lands within the boundaries. Many of Buffalo's great commercial, institutional, public, and ecclesiastical buildings are contained within this historic enclave.
