Principle 9: ACHP recognizes that scientific research, physical anthropology, forensic science, and human biology represent longstanding academic disciplines that contribute to human understand, medical advances, and public education. Human remains from archaeological sites have been and will continue to be importance sources of knowledge about the human biological and cultural past. Federal agencies should recognize and balance the needs for significant scientific research with religious and cultural beliefs.
