Paul Scales (Pacific Islands Area Assistant Director of Technology (PIA ADT) asked me to send my comments to you regarding the ACHP draft policy. I went through the document as requested. Thank you for the reminder at our last teleconference. I did discuss it a bit with the West Hawaii Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) representative Ruby McDonald.

My concern is a state matter, not of a national concern: that the HI SHPD's rules assumes whenever human burials are found, that they are Native Hawaiians. Other ethnic groups are not considered.
