Dear Ms Hauser:

Aloha , I greet you as President of Kulana Huli Honua, 501-C3 organization based in Kona Hawaii such that this email (as there is no time for formal letters) become a matter for the record. Mr Fred Cachola is now president of Na Kokua Kaloko Honokohau and I am also a member of this organization begun circa 1993. I sit on Kahu Ku Mauna, an advisory committee to the State of Hawaii through the Mauna Kea Management Board. I and my organization associates are regular, active participants in the meetings of Hawaii Island Burial Council. This is just MY background, imagine the scores of other indigenous Ones who exist and who, like me are heavily involved with matters of burials, relations with the United States regarding the status of the Hawaiian Nation and those who would like to be.

Thanks to Fred Cachola, our board was informed of your office and your upcoming meetings. Immediately, I and others began the task of informing as many Hawaiian organizations as we possibly could for these most crucially important meetings. Then, this past week I noted an email sent by Alan Murakami of the NHLC on O'ahu which contained the full, vitally important, schedule of your meetings. This had not been made available to my or to many other organizations of my island.

My question is, with all the relations you have with the given offices that purportedly represent Hawaiian people, i.e, SHPD, OHA, Department of Hawaiian Homes Lands and trusts, **HOW IS IT** that on Hawaii Island, the majority of Hawaiian groups absolutely committed to care for sacred properties and unrelenting work of communication with and on behalf at times of the multitude of 'Ohana of O'iwi on Hawaii Island and beyond **HAVE NOT** been informed by participating parties? Is this outcome of oversight borne of bureaucratic apathy? Is it done intentionally? If so, the actions are seen and noted.

Hasn't it been the intent of your office and your mandate to inform the indigenous people of Hawaii of these hearings? It is serious and noteworthy enough that you are only holding 2 meetings in Hawaii - one on O'ahu and one on my island. What of the 'O'iwi of Kaua'i, Niihau, Moloka'i, Maui, Lana'i & Kahoolawe?

It's a very sad testament to the effectiveness of your office to handle the matters so dear to Hawaiian 'O'iwi. I have informed Kulana Huli Honua, the Reinstated Hawaiian Kingdom, Nee Papa Aupuni Hawaii, Kahu Ku Mauna, Mauna Kea Te Anaina Hou, Na Kahu O Kaluaokalani, Keopuka 'Ohana, Laaloa 'Ohana and numerous individuals.

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I hope for a favorable number in presence at your hearings on my island. To hear there were a mere 34 at your O'ahu meeting is a travesty to me. In this day and age, there should be a way of communicating with 3400, indeed, with ALL 'Oiwi on matters as significant as this work is.
