


106 Essentials Course: Albuquerque, NM

“The Section 106 Essentials” course will be held on Tuesday, September 20 and Wednesday, September 21, 2011.

Important note: Classes are filled on a first come/first served basis of registrations received with payment at the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP). You must be confirmed by the ACHP to be admitted to class.

Registration: For individuals paying by credit card, [on-line registration is available](#). For individuals paying by check or SF 182, [download the registration form](#) and fax to 202-606-5073. For those registering as a group, [download the group registration form](#) and fax to 202-606-5073.

Course Location and Accommodations: The course is being held at the historic Hotel Andaluz, 125 2nd St NW, Albuquerque, NM, 87102. <http://www.hotelandaluz.com/>. Situated in the heart of downtown Albuquerque, Andaluz is located at 125 2nd Street NW on the southwest corner of 2nd Street and Copper Avenue. It is one block from the Albuquerque Convention Center. A limited block of rooms has been secured for attendees for Monday and Tuesday, September 19-20 at the government rate of \$81 for a single occupancy plus applicable state and local tax (7%). **It is recommended that you make your reservations early, as the rooms are likely to sell out. Reservations must be made by Monday, August 29, 2011.** Reservations made after that date will be accepted on a space available basis at whatever rate is available at the time of the reservation. **To reserve your room**, call the reservations line at 1-877-987-9090 and state that you are with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation and ask for the rate of \$81.



Traveling to Albuquerque:

- The Albuquerque International Sunport (<http://www.cabq.gov/airport/>) is 4.7 miles from the Andaluz. It is 63 miles from Santa Fe (one hour driving time).

Driving Directions from the Sunport: Depart Sunport Blvd SE; Turn left to stay on Sunport Blvd SE; Take ramp right for I-25 North / Historic Route 66 toward Santa Fe / Downtown; At exit 224A, take ramp right for Oak St SE toward Coal Ave / Lead Ave / Central Ave; Turn left onto Lead Ave SE; Road name changes to Lead Ave SW; Turn right onto 2nd St SW; Road name changes to 2nd St NW; Arrive at 125 2nd St NW.

Parking: Andaluz offers parking options for overnight guests - self parking is \$10.00 a day and valet parking is \$16.00 a day

Hotel Information: Following a \$30 million renovation, the historic La Posada de Albuquerque Hotel has been transformed into the pre-eminent "Green" boutique hotel in the Southwest. Hotel Andaluz has a rich history as a downtown Albuquerque Hotel. It opened in 1939 as the first hotel in New Mexico constructed by New Mexico native Conrad Hilton. In 1984, it was placed on the National Register of Historic Places. While under renovation, the ownership was determined to incorporate many green initiatives into the building: Furnishings, equipment, and demolition debris were recycled; the hotel generates 100% of its guest room hot water using solar energy; interior finishes have been carefully selected to incorporate LEED approved natural and low VOC emissions products. In addition to the hotel's in-house Cultural Center, the following are just five minutes from the hotel Museum of Natural History and Science; Indian Pueblo Cultural Center; National Hispanic Cultural Center.

Registration: Registration will be located outside the conference room on Tuesday, September 20 at 8:00 a.m. Plan to stop by the registration desk to check in and to pick up your course notebook and other course materials.

Schedule: *The Section 106 Essentials* course runs from 8:30 a.m. to approximately 4:30 p.m. each day. Short breaks will be given in the morning and afternoon with a longer break for lunch.

Meals: Light morning fare and an afternoon snack are provided each day. The cost of this food is included in your registration fee. All other meals are on your own.

Attire for Training Course: Attire for the course is casual. Also, please keep in mind that hotel meeting rooms tend to be cool, so plan to bring a sweater or jacket.

Cancellations: Registrants who cancel at least 14 days prior to the start of the course will receive a full refund minus a 15% processing fee. No refunds will be given for cancellations made fewer than 14 days before the start of the course; however, substitutions may be made at no cost up until three days before the course begins. All cancellations must be made in writing.
