MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Veterans Administration (VA) has determined that construction of a clinical addition in front of Building #5 at the Veterans Administration Medical Center, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, (Center) will have an effect upon the Center, a property eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, and has requested the comments of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (Council) pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470f) and its implementing regulations, "Protection of Historic and Cultural Properties" (36 CFR Part 800),

NOW, THEREFORE, the VA, the South Dakota State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), and the Council agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the addition on the resource.


Stipulations

The VA will ensure that the following measures are carried out.


1. Building #5 will be photographically recorded prior to alteration so that there will be a permanent record of its history and appearance. The Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS) (National Park Service, Department of the Interior, Washington, DC 20243, 202-343-9606) will first be contacted to determine what documentation is required. All documentation must be accepted by HABS, and the Council notified of its acceptance, prior to the alteration. Copies of this documentation will be provided to the South Dakota SHPO.

2. The original construction documents for Building #5 will be forwarded to the National Archives and Records Service, Washington, DC, 20408, for permanent storage. The Cartographic and Architectural Branch of the National Archives (703-756-6700) will first be contacted to determine what drawings and contract documents will be submitted.

Execution of this Memorandum of Agreement evidences that the VA has afforded the Council an opportunity to comment on the clinical addition and its effects on the Veterans Administration Medical Center, Sioux Falls, SD and that the VA has taken into account the effects of the project on the historic resource.




