Employees, former employees, and applicants who believe that they have been discriminated against by a federal agency have the right to file a complaint with that agency. The first step is to contact an EEO counselor at the agency within 45 days of the alleged discriminatory act, or in the case of a personnel action, within 45 days of the effective date of the personnel action.

The individual may choose to participate in either counseling or alternative dispute resolution (ADR). Ordinarily, counseling must be completed within 30 days and ADR within 90 days. At the end of counseling or ADR, if the matter is not resolved, the individual may then file a complaint with the agency.
