AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT AMONG

WASHINGTON. DC

("Agreement")

WHEREAS the Agreement was executed on March 4, 2010 and an amendment was executed on December 9, 2010; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Agreement, Stipulation I.C ("Construction Staging"), site work for the undertaking slightly expands the Limit of Disturbance ("LOD") to accommodate slope stabilization measures to protect the northern slope adjacent to the Barry Farm neighborhood in support of the Perimeter Security Improvements and campus stormwater management improvements. These measures include: removal of the non-historic succession tree growth along the northern slope and restoration to its historic open condition; elimination of the previously approved retaining wall beneath the inner perimeter fence; stabilization of the slope by re-grading to a 2:1 incline; and incorporation of drainage swales to improve storm water management. These slight adjustments do not result in any significant additional adverse effects to the NHL.

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with Stipulation VII ("Amendments"), the Signatories agree to amend the MOA as follows:

- Amend the LOD identified in the Construction Staging Plan (Exhibit 4) to include the slope stabilization measures, as depicted herein. This amendment, in its entirety, is integrated into the MOA as Exhibit 4, superseding all previous versions of Exhibit 4.
- 2. Add the North Slope Stabilization Measures as Exhibit 16 to revise the design of the perimeter fence at the North Slope location and accommodate for slope stabilization measures.

Execution and implementation of this Amendment to the MOA by the Signatories, and implementation of its terms, shall evidence that GSA has afforded the ACHP and DCHPO an opportunity to comment on the Undertaking and its effects, and that GSA has taken into account the effects of the Undertaking on historic properties in compliance with 36 C.F.R. Part 800 and Sections 106 and 110 of the NHPA.



- Design revisions for the stabilization of the North Slope include:
 - Remove invasive succession tree growth along the northern slope and restore it to its historic open condition;
 - Remove unstable rubble fill and reduce the incline of the slope from 1:1 to 2:1;
 - Incorporate drainage swales to support storm water management improvements;
 - Eliminate the retaining wall beneath the inner perimeter fence
