



MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the General Services Administration (GSA) has determined that the transfer of 50 acres at the Fort Worth Federal Center to the United States Postal Service(USPS) for a new City of Fort Worth maintenance facility will have an effect on Shed Warehouses #13 & 14 which are eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places and has consulted with the Texas State Historic Preservation Office. pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800, regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act; and

NOW THEREFORE, GSA, and the Texas State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the proposed undertaking on historic properties:

Stipulations

GSA will insure the following measures are carried out:

1. Documentation of Shed Warehouse buildings #13 & 14 as requested by the SHPO. The documentation shall consist of 5 inch X 7 inch black and white photographic documentation on archival paper. Also, a plan sketch of each building showing the dimensions shall be provided.
2. The historic context of Shed Warehouse buildings #13 & 14 and the Fort Worth Federal Center are already well documented in your copy of "The Fort Worth Federal Center: An Architectural And Historical Assessment."

Execution of this Memorandum of Agreement and implementation of its terms evidence that GSA and SHPO have consulted on the GSA's proposal to transfer approximately 50 acres of land at the Fort Worth Federal Center to USPS, and its effects on this historic property, and that GSA has taken into account such effects on the historic property.
