6	THE CONNECTICUT STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER
7	REGARDING
8	a PROPOSED SURGICAL and CLINICAL TOWER at
9	THE WEST HAVEN VETERANS AFFAIRS MEDICAL CENTER,
10	950 CAMPBELL AVENUE, WEST HAVEN, NEW HAVEN COUNTY, CONNECTICUT
11	
12	WHEREAS, the Connecticut Health Care System of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)
13	proposes to have an Architecture/Engineering firm design and build a new surgical and clinical tower
14	estimated to hold 161,815 square feet (BGSF) of space at the West Haven Veterans Affairs Medical
15	Center (VAMC) at 950 Campbell Avenue, West Haven, Connecticut (Attachment 1), to address current
16	critical deficiencies related to utility failures, infection prevention issues, patient and staff safety concerns,
17	and space constraints (undertaking); and
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19	WHEREAS, VA has determined that the undertaking is subject to review under Section 106 of the
20	National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966, as amended, and its implementing regulations, 36
21	CFR Part 800—Protection of Historic Properties; and
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23	WHEREAS, VA, in consultation with the Connecticut State Preservation Officer (SHPO), has
24	determined, and SHPO has concurred, that due to extensive surface and subsurface disturbance in all
25	areas of the West Haven VAMC, and the negligible potential for intact, significant archaeological
26	resources, as documented in "Phase IA Archeological Assessment of the West Haven Veterans Affairs
27	Medical Center (VAMC), West Haven, CT" (Kosack et al., 2016), the undertaking will have no effect on
28	archaeological historic properties, as defined in 36 CFR 800.16(1); and
29	
30	WHEREAS, VA, in consultation with the SHPO, has determined, and the SHPO has concurred, that
31	historic architectural resources will be affected by the undertaking and that the Area of Potential Effects
32	(APE) consists of the boundaries for the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP)-listed "West Haven
33	Veterans Administration Hospital/William Wirt Winchester Memorial Hospital Historic District"
34	(Attachment 2), and
35	
36	WHEREAS, the proposed undertaking is still in the pre-design phase with three site options under
37	consideration, and VA has not yet finalized the site or design for the undertaking, and, therefore, the full
38	range of effects on architectural historic properties cannot be fully determined at this time; and
39	
40	WHEREAS, VA has determined that it is appropriate to develop a programmatic agreement (PA) in
41	accordance with 36 CFR § 800.14(b), including 800.14(b)(1)(ii), which recognizes that a PA may be used
42	when effects on historic properties cannot be fully determined prior to approval of an undertaking; and
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44	WHEREAS, VA has consulted with the SHPO on the proposed undertaking, pursuant to Section 106 of
45	the NHPA and its implementing regulations; and
46	
47	WHEREAS, VA, in consultation with the SHPO, has determined that completion of the undertaking on
48	any of the three site options under consideration will have effects on historic resources (i.e., contributing
49 50	buildings to the NRHP-listed historic district), pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.4, which are: Site Option 1 (Courtyard): demolition of Buildings #6 and #7 (Attachment 3); Site Option 2 (Parking Lot 7): demolition

- 51 of Buildings #6, #7, #8, #9 and #10 (Attachment 4); and Site Option 3 (Loading Dock): demolition of 52 Buildings #7, #8, #9, and #10 (Attachment 5); and

54 WHEREAS, VA has notified the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) of potential effects to historic properties and of VA's intent to develop a PA, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.6(a)(1)(i)(C), 55 and the ACHP had chosen not to participate in the consultation, pursuant to 30 CFR § 800.6(a)(1)(iii); 56 57 and

58

59 WHEREAS, subsequently, SHPO requested that ACHP participate in the consultation, and based on 60 that request ACHP has chosen to participate in the consultation, pursuant to 30 CFR § 800.6(a)(1)(iii); 61 and

62

63 WHEREAS, VA invited the following Federally recognized tribes (Tribes) that might attach religious and cultural significance to historic properties in the City of West Haven or New Haven County, CT, to 64 participate in consultation, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.2(c)(2): the Mashantucket Western Pequot Tribal 65 Nation and the Mohegan Tribe of Indians of Connecticut; who have not elected to participate as 66

67 consulting parties; and

68 69 WHEREAS, VA invited the following historical and preservation groups that might have a

70 demonstrated interest in the undertaking to participate in consultation, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.2(c)(5):

71 Connecticut Historical Society and Museum, the New Haven Preservation Trust, the New Haven

Museum, Preservation Connecticut, the West Haven Historical Society; and the West Haven Veterans 72

73 Museum, who have not elected to participate as consulting parties; and

74

75 WHEREAS, VA has provided the public with information about the undertaking and is seeking comment and input, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.2(d), through National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) 76 77 compliance efforts. The thirty (30) day comment period commenced on September 22, 2022, and will 78 conclude on October 23, 2022. VA will review all comments and relay to SHPO any comments received

79 that pertain to cultural resources.

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81 NOW, THEREFORE, VA and the SHPO, as Signatory Parties, agree that the undertaking shall be 82 implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to allow VA to select a location and 83 finalize the design for the new Surgical and Clinical Tower and to continue consultation on effects of the

84 undertaking on historic properties.

STIPULATIONS

88 VA shall ensure that the following measures are carried out:

I. APPLICABILITY

- a. VA is responsible for ensuring implementation of the stipulations in this PA associated with the undertaking..
- b. The Anti-Deficiency Act, 31 U.S.C. 1341, prohibits federal agencies from incurring an obligation of funds in advance of or in excess of available appropriations. Accordingly, the parties agree that any requirement for the obligation of funds arising from the terms of this PA shall be subject to the availability of appropriated funds for that purpose, and that this agreement shall not be interpreted to require the obligation of funds in violation of the Anti-Deficiency Act.

99	II.	GENERAL
100		a. Parties shall send and accept official notices, comments, requests for additional
101		information and/or documentation, and all other communications required by this PA via
102		email.
103		b. Time designations shall be in calendar days.
104		c. For the purposes of this PA, the definitions provided in 36 CFR § $800.16(a)$ through (z)
105		shall apply.
106		d. VA shall ensure that Federal or Contractor staff who meet the applicable Secretary of the
107		Interior's Professional Qualification Standards (36 CFR § 61) in the appropriate
108		discipline (e.g., architectural history, history, archaeology, architecture, or historic
109		architecture) will participate in the review and implementation required as part of this
110		PA.
111		e. After selecting the site option for the new surgical and medical tower, VA will move to
112		continuation of consultation with the SHPO as described in Stipulation III.
113		
114	III.	CONTINUATION of CONSULTATION
115		a. VA has completed identification and documentation of historic resources at the West
116		Haven VAMC and has prepared and submitted a National Register of Historic Places
117		nomination form for the West Haven Veterans Administration Hospital/William Wirt
118		Winchester Memorial Hospital Historic District, which was approved and listed in the
119		National Register on May 26, 2022.
120		b. VA has applied the criteria of effect consistent with 36 CFR § 800.5(a) and determined
121		that the undertaking will have an adverse effect on historic properties and SHPO has
122		concurred.
123		c. VA has determined, as noted above, that the degree of adverse effects will be different at
124		the three site options since each option affects a different number of historic resources.
125		VA, in consultation with the SHPO, will seek to mitigate the effects commensurate with
126		the degree of effect and the number of historic resources affected. VA will seek to
127		execute a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with SHPO, pursuant to 36 CFR §
128 129		800.6(b), to determine an appropriate level of mitigative measures for the undertaking.
129	IV.	EXECUTION and DURATION
130	1 V.	
132		a. This PA shall be executed in counterparts with a separate page for each Signatory. VA shall file a complete copy of the executed PA, including all signatory pages and
132		attachments, with the ACHP and distribute a copy to the SHPO.
134		b. This PA shall expire if its stipulations are not carried out within ten (10) years from the
135		date of execution, unless it is terminated prior to that date. Six (6) months prior to the
136		expiration date, VA may consult with the other Signatories to reconsider the terms of the
137		PA and amend it in accordance with Stipulation VII below.
138		
139	V.	DISPUTE RESOLUTION
140		a. Should any party to this PA object in writing to the implementation of any stipulation(s)
141		of this PA, and VA determines that the objection cannot be resolved, VA will:
142		i. Forward all documentation relevant to the dispute, including VA's proposed
143		resolution, to the ACHP. The ACHP shall provide VA with its advice on the
144		resolution of the objection within thirty (30) days of receiving adequate
145		documentation. Prior to reaching a final decision on the dispute, VA shall
146		prepare a written response that takes into account any timely advice or
147		comments regarding the dispute from the ACHP and provide them with a copy
148		of this response. VA will then proceed according to its final decision.

If the ACHP does not provide its advice regarding the dispute within thirty (30) days, VA may make a final decision on the dispute and proceed accordingly. Prior to reaching such a final decision, VA shall prepare a written response which takes into account any timely comments regarding the dispute from the SHPO and provide it and the ACHP with a copy of such written response with its final decision. VA's responsibility to carry out all actions under this PA that are not the subject of the dispute shall remain unchanged. Should a member of the public object in writing to VA regarding the manner in which the measures stipulated in this PA are being implemented, VA shall notify the SHPO and ACHP and consider the views of the member(s) of the public making such objection in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.2(d).

163	v 1.	a.	Any signatory to this PA may propose that it be amended, whereupon the Signatories
164		u.	shall consult to consider such an amendment.
165		b.	Any amendment will be agreed to in writing by all Signatories and will be effective on
166			the date a copy with all signatures is filed with the ACHP.
167			
168	VII.	TERMI	INATION
169		a.	If VA determines that it cannot implement the terms of this PA, or if the SHPO determines
170			that the PA is not being properly implemented, either party may propose to the other party
171			that the PA be terminated.
172		b.	The part proposing termination shall so notify the other Signatories to this PA explaining
173			the reason(s) for termination and affording at least thirty (30) days to consult and seek an
174			alternative to termination.
175		с.	Should such consultation fail, and the PA is terminated, VA shall either consult to develop
176			a new agreement, in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.6, or request the comments of the
177			ACHP, under 36 CFR § 800.7(a).

179			AND IMPLEMENTATION of this PA and implementation of its terms evidence that
180			nto account the effects of this undertaking on historic properties and afforded the ACHP an
181	oppor	tunity to c	comment.

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






Attachment 1. Location of West Haven VAMC
